Euclid Hall was originally built as an apartment building in 1903. After the Stock Market crash of 1929 the apartments were split into separate rooms and the building became the Euclid Hall Hotel. In the 1940's it was converted into Single Room Occupancy. Under the sponsorship of the West Side Federation for Senior and Supportive Housing, Inc. (WSFSSH), Euclid Hall was acquired in 1989. With the financial assistance of the New York City SRO Loan Program, the building underwent a major renovation.



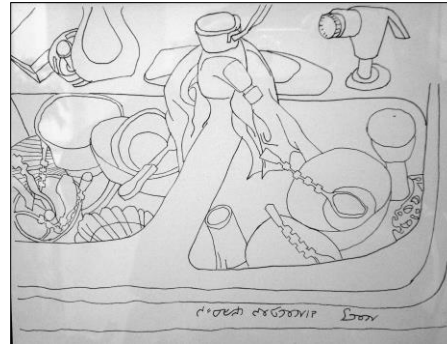
There are 273 SINGLE rooms within Euclid Hall. These rooms provide permanent supportive housing for single low-income adults, including individuals with special needs and working persons.

Tenants have their own rooms with a bed, sink, refrigerator and closet. Kitchens and bathrooms are shared and cleaned daily by the maintenance staff. Tenants have a key to their rooms and the suite in which they live. There is 24-hour front-desk security with a strict guest policy.

Building Management is located on site and the building superintendent lives on site. A professional team of social workers and program aides are based within Euclid Hall for the benefit of tenants.

We have available:

- ◆ Intake screening for prospective tenants
- ◆ Individual counseling
- ◆ Psychiatric consultation
- ◆ Case management services
- ◆ Full time Visiting Nurse on site
- ◆ Team of program aides to assist those with special needs
- ◆ Monday-Friday morning, afternoon, and evening recreation programs
- ◆ Saturday afternoon movie and lunch
- ◆ A variety of on-going activity groups
- ◆ Monthly themed celebrations
- ◆ Occasional trips in and outside the city



Located on Broadway between 85th and 86th Streets, Euclid Hall is situated in the heart of the Upper West Side. Located in the midst of shopping, transportation, and entertainment, it is easy to see why the residents of Euclid Hall are fully integrated into the local community. The number 1 subway stops at the corner of 86th and Broadway as well as the M104 and M86 buses.



WHAT ARE THE CRITERIA FOR TENANCY?

- ◆ Single
- ◆ 50 years and older
- ◆ Low income
- ◆ Applicants with a substance abuse history must be able to demonstrate a commitment to sobriety.
- ◆ Individuals must be able to live independently within the range of on-site services provided at Euclid Hall.
- ◆ Individuals must be able to administer their own medication.

Most referrals to Euclid Hall must come through the NYC Department of Homeless Services.
